A RESTAURANT'S ROAD TO RECOVERY

Due to steep reopening costs on top of debt accumulated while shut down during the pandemic:

A typical table-service restaurant could be facing **more than \$90,000 in losses*** and between **17 and 35 months** to return to positive cash flow.

Rehiring, training and prep \$8,116

SUPPLIES

Restocking food and beverage inventory \$14,000

Safety equipment and other health and safety supplies \$19,020

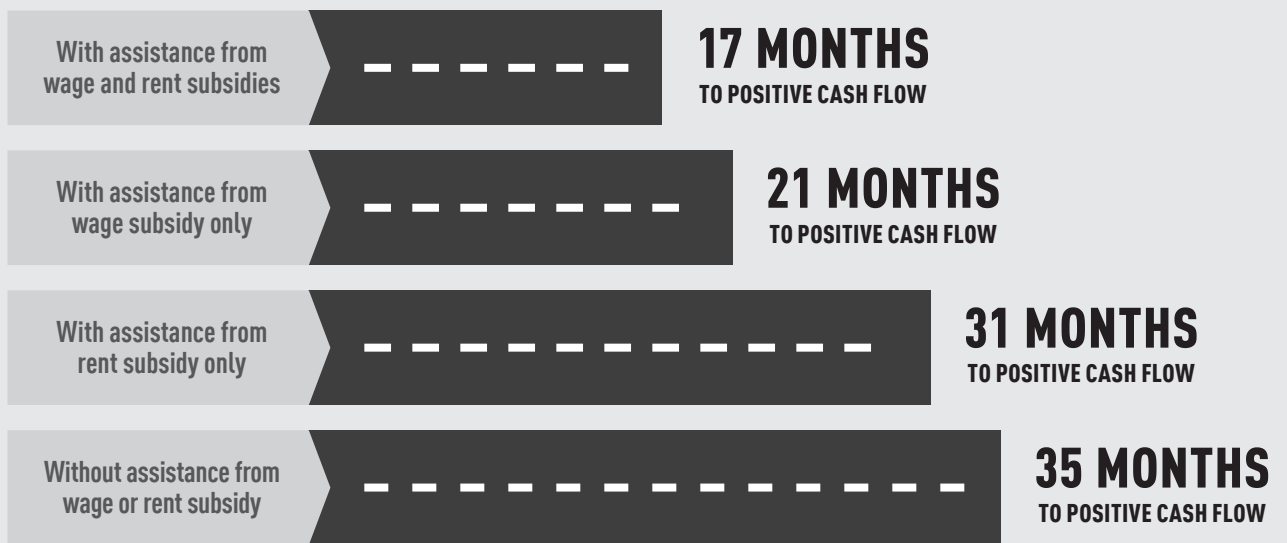
PROMOTION

Marketing and advertising \$5,000

TOTAL COSTS TO REOPEN ON-PREMISE DINING SERVICES **\$46,136**
